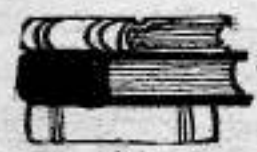
Sally Cornman, dinner chairman, and her helpers will serve a spaghetti dinner with all the trimmings, beginning at 12 noon.

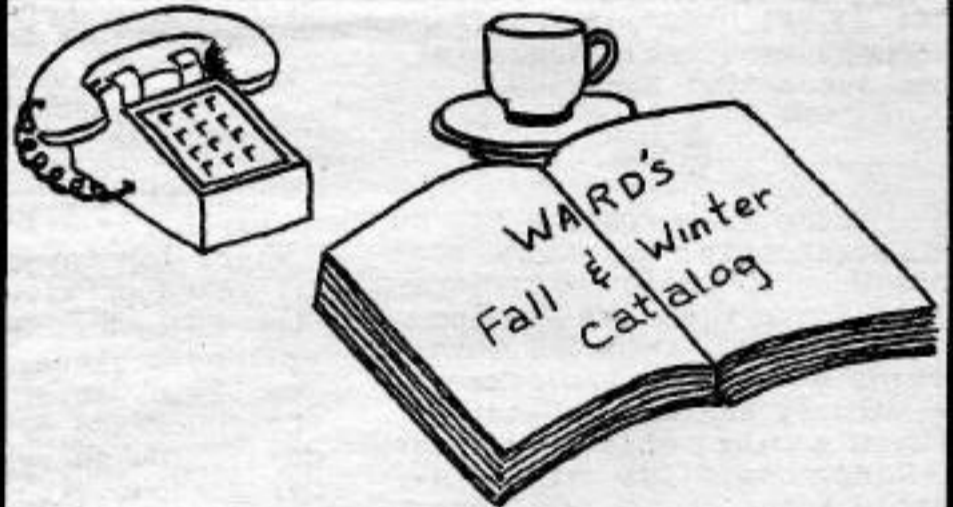
FOOD WORKSHOP

FREE RECREATION PROGRAM

The Peninsula Youth Program, a non-profit youth services organization, will be operating a summer recreation program for kids, ages 8 to 13, on both the Key and Gig Harbor Peninsulas this summer. The program will offer a variety of activities (sports, games, arts and crafts, nature study, etc.) on a rotating basis at several sites. Morning sessions will be from 9:30 to 12:00, and afternoon sessions from 1:30 to 4:00. Key Peninsula sites will include Vaughn and Evergreen schools, the new Key Peninsula Recreation Field, the Civic Center in Vaughn, the Longbranch Community Hall and Penrose and R.F.K. Parks.

Peninsula Youth Program recreation workers, including one adult supervisor and five to seven youth supervisors, ages 15 to 21, will generally be at each of the sites once or twice a week. Weekly schedules will be printed in the Gateway paper and posted at the Civic Center and local stores. The program will operate from June 27 to August 23.

Parental permission slips are required for all participants. These slips were handed out to all students in grades 3 to 8, but will also be available at the sites. The program is open to all peninsula kids, ages 8 to 13, and the Peninsula Youth Program hopes to get as much participation as possible.

**ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS

To reiterate the telephone numbers to use when calling the fire department: if you have an emergency or fire and you have an 884 number you dial 884-2161. If no emergency or fire, please dial 884-2222. If you have an 857 number, you dial 857-2311 emergency. Other business is 857-2291.

You see, when you dial the emergency number, the alarm system is locked up for 4 to 5 minutes. This means that no one else can call the fire department during this period if they have an emergency. So, if all you desire is information, please use the business number. We have telephone stickers with emergency numbers on them. You may pick them up at the headquarters station in Key Center.

Some of you may have noticed some fire fighters next to the Vaughn school. This house has been used for training purposes. These sessions provide excellent training to update the capabilities of the personnel. The public is welcome to come to these training sessions and observe the volunteers in action. We will have a session in Home this month.

PACIFIC RIM-CANADA TRIP

A 5 day trip via Trailways bus from August 10 to 15 is the next jaunt planned for the Peninsula Travelers. Four nights accommodations, Butchart Gardens, British Columbia Forest Museum, baggage handling and \$1,000 accident insurance coverage, the package tour cost for the minimum of 33 passengers will be \$147 each, double occupancy, \$150 twin and \$187 single.
