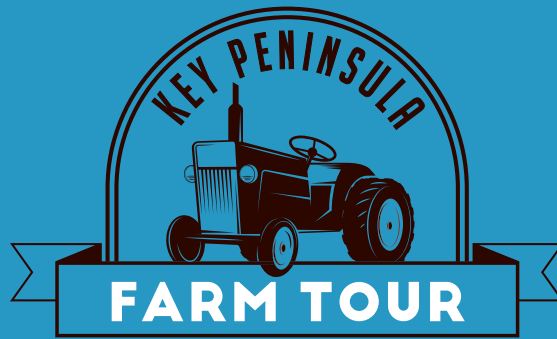

Nancy learned Hawaiian quilting from Margaret Luika Kamaka in Kailua, Oahu, while living there. She says, “I began making Hawaiian quilts in 1978, and immediately became intrigued with the history and folklore; the traditions and superstitions that are interwoven with Hawaiian quilt making and the mysterious story of how they began.”

When her family returned to Seattle in 1982, she began teaching Hawaiian quilt making and she has been making traditional and art quilts since. “I’ve made other types of pieced and appliquéd quilts, but Hawaiian quilts remain my passion.”

“Woodland Lei” (above) was created to remind her of the Northwest’s fall colors. It was the first quilt offered by Pacific Rim Quilt Company, started in 1991 with her sister, later selling it to old friend Connie Saylor who continues to offer Chong’s distinctive patterns.

As a teacher, stress-free needle turn hand appliqué is her specialty. She says, “I put students directly in touch with their needle, thread and fabric. I show how incredibly easy appliqué is without the use of freezer paper, toothpicks, starch, cardboard, plastic, back-basting, ironing or interfacing — all things that needlessly complicate what is otherwise a very simple process.”

Her motto is “I’m a nicer person because of hand appliqué.” Chong added, “Appliqué is a useful skill for all quilters and needle-workers. Need to cover a spot on a quilt? Appliqué a patch over it. Need to fix an accidental cut in your fabric? Appliqué a patch over it. Need to add a design element to a quilt or garment? Appliqué a motif exactly where you want it to be!”

She concluded, “It’s time for me to confess the embarrassing details of my sordid past. The evidence of addiction is in my quilts, quilts and more quilts. By the way, I am not seeking treatment!”
